



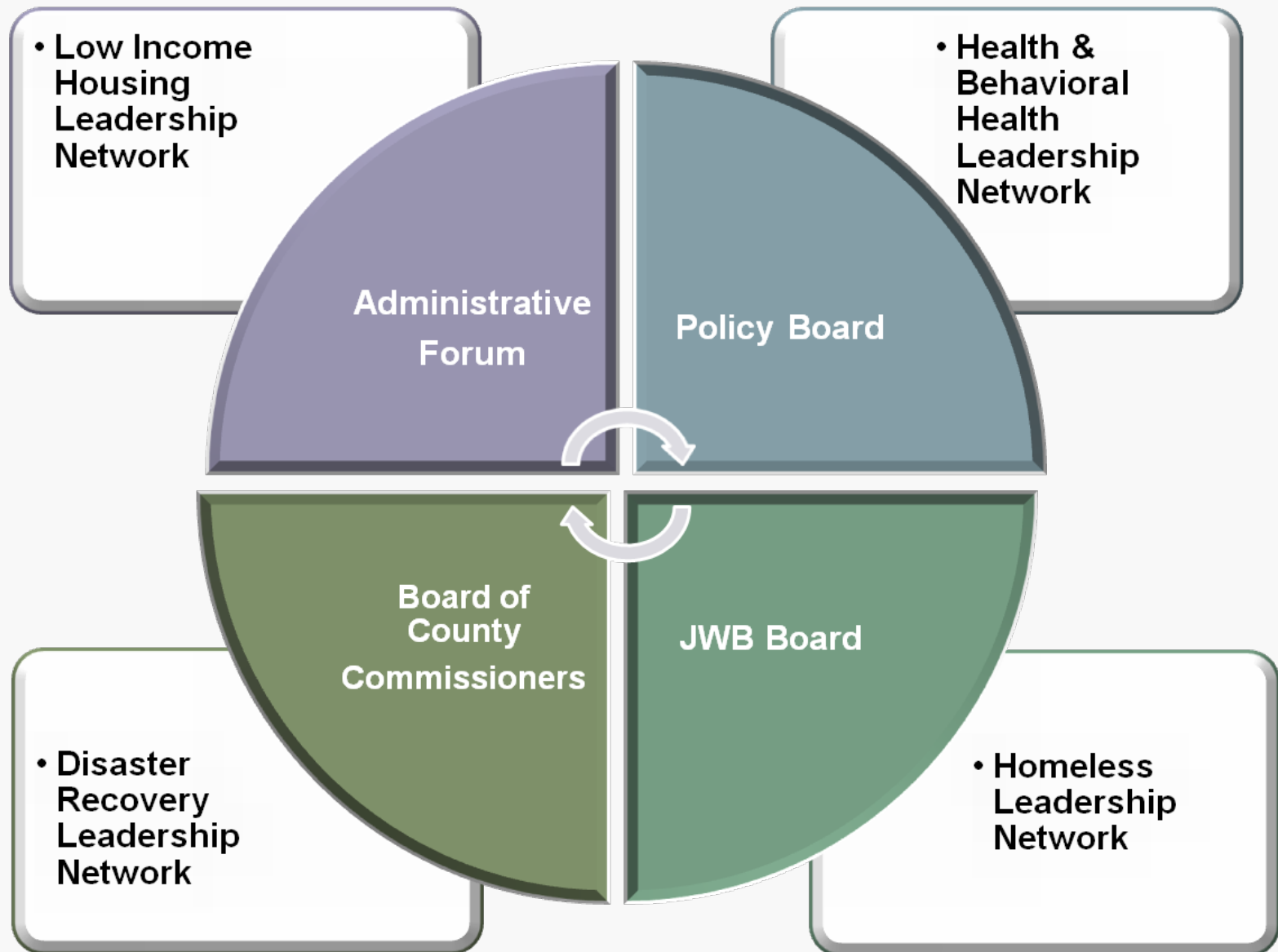

Purpose of Communications Plan

- Guidance for human service response efforts in Pinellas County, FL, after natural disasters and emergencies including, but not limited to, hurricanes, tornadoes, high winds, and flooding
- Ensure notification of staff identified to execute the plan, provide guidance in establishing the objective of restoring services, facilitating communication between participants, and coordinate short-term assistance
- Complements Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP)

Components: Pre-Disaster Activities

- Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP) - measures, taken pre-, during, and post-disaster, that are designed to maximize the operational capability of an agency – contingent on personal and disaster plans

- **Ensure information in 2-1-1 Tampa Bay Cares I & R system is up-to-date**

Components: When Disaster Strikes

- Agencies execute disaster plan, emphasizing first and foremost the safety of clients and staff
- Employees execute their personal disaster plans to ensure the safety of their loved ones

Components: Post-Disaster Activities

- Agencies put Continuity of Operations Plan into effect
- Disaster Recovery Leadership Network activates the Recovery Management Center
- **Agencies provide an Agency Status Report; call 2-1-1 from within Pinellas County and call 727-210-4211 if calling from another county**
- Agencies update status as required

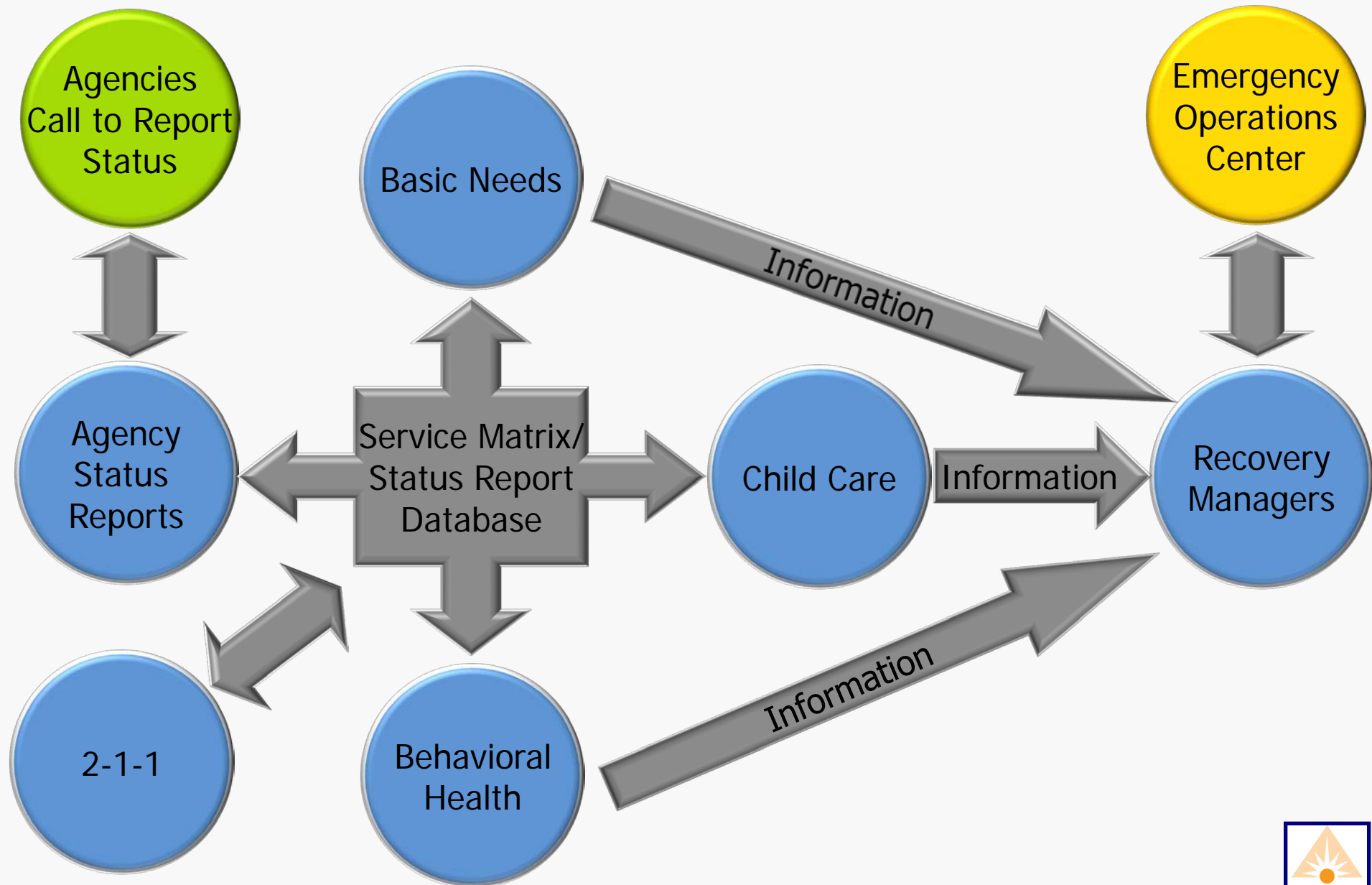

Two Critical Elements

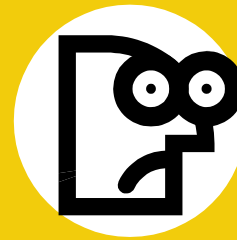
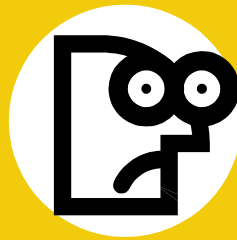
- Chain of Command – Recovery Management Center works to augment and support Pinellas County Emergency Management
